The Elephant Story

People dealing with wild elephants know that it is generally a shy animal, avoiding human beings and loving its privacy within the forests. At the same time, the elephant is also a wild and mighty animal. Its requirement of food and living space is also very large.

It is, therefore, only natural that it should come in contact with human being sometime or the other and some problem should arise. In fact, cases

of crop damage and occasional man-killing by wild elephants have been recorded since time immemorial in all elephant areas. People have also been killing or injuring elephants in defense of their life and property. But such cases used to be few and far between in the past. In recent years, however, elephant has been observed to be straying out of forest much more frequently and causing large scale depredation in human localities.


